May-2025-Annual-Town-Meeting Warrant

Town Meeting May 5th, 2025 - All residents should attend and hold your Town Meeting Members and Politicians accountable:

Do we want Needham or Cambridge? On January 14th, Needham voters turned out in historic numbers (almost 12,000). We were falsely told if we voted NO, the town would be *sued* and *lose millions in funding*.

But just hours before polls closed, the State quietly announced: **Needham will not be sued. Needham will not lose funding.**

Then, at the Feb. 13 public hearing, Planning Board member and attorney confirmed that a Catch-22 is buried in the housing language: Developers get permits—

Towns get the bill. Infrastructure isn't funded.

One week later, **State Auditor** Diana DiZoglio declared that the controversial "**housing law is an unfunded mandate...** [it] does not provide a funding mechanism for compliance with its provisions."

So now with Town Meeting on May 5th approaching fast, and many NHP proponents re-elected. Will they:

- Consider the approximately \$1 Billion in yet unfunded Needham infrastructure?
- Consider that the Pollard project alone will add \$2,700 to the average homeowner's tax bill?
- And "tap the brakes" on large expenditures.

Or will they push us further toward a future we didn't vote for—one that turns

Needham into... Brookline-by-the-Charles? Cambridge West? West

Roxburham? Wheedham Commons – Live. Work. Gridlock."?
